DIOCESAN BOOKKEEPING POLICY: As we approach year end, parishioners frequently wish to make contributions to the church that will be credited to their tax receipt for the current year. Diocesan bookkeeping policy requires that parish books close on December 31. Contributions made in January cannot be applied to 2017 offerings.

OFFERING ENVELOPES: For 2018, everyone who uses envelopes has been assigned a new number. And there are smaller boxes of envelopes for those enrolled in our pre-authorized giving program. *At the end of December, it is essential that you discard all your previous envelopes so that donations can be properly recorded.*



HELPING CHILDREN THROUGH OUR BOWING ANGEL: A long-standing tradition at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish is the presence of the bowing angel by the manger scene, who graciously bows her head after an offering is made. Again this year, all donations received from the bowing angel will be sent to the School Sisters of Notre Dame Children’s Project in Kenya who work with children whose parents have died of HIV-

AIDS. Since the bowing angel cannot digest paper, a plate will be by the angel to accept paper offerings. (Cheques should be made payable to “Our Lady of Lourdes Church”.)

TREE OF LIFE: It is a tradition here at Our Lady of Lourdes to call the large tree in the sanctuary the “*Tree of Life*” for the decorations on it reflect two of the great Christian mysteries: *birth and death*. On the tree, there will be **50 angels** each inscribed with the name of a child baptized in the parish since last Christmas, and **24 crosses** in memory of those born to eternal life. When the Christmas season is over, these personalized ornaments will be available as mementos to family members. Parents with children baptized this year are encouraged to have a photo taken with the child by the tree and to keep this with the ornament.

LONGEST NIGHT SERVICE: If you are grieving, lonely or sad for any reason as the Christmas season approaches, please consider attending this ecumenical service. Thursday, December 21, at 7:00 p.m. at St. Francis of Assisi Parish, 49 Blueridge Ave., Kitchener. This will be an evening of scripture, reflective music and prayer. Dear friends,

We settle in for another Christmas season. Christmas is always a blessing, a time for giving thanks – especially for the Father’s gift to us: Jesus, Emmanuel, God-with-us – even though many struggle at this time of year.

A good friend, a brother Priest, and a member of the Religious community to which I belong, *Father Chris Rushton*, is being cared for at Emmanuel Hospice in Hamilton, one of the many Good Shepherd ministries. It means, simply, that he is in the process of dying. (I am glad that “The Good Shepherd” is caring for him!)

Father Chris is a remarkable person. He accepts the inevitable with great faith and serenity, and he expresses profound gratitude for every act of kindness he receives – a visit, a gift, a service, a chat, and he is *always* looking for ways to “give back”. He is an inspiration to those who experience both his joy and the enthusiasm he brings to each day.

His is the example that might guide us: gratitude for each day – the fundamental gift – the gift of life. Aware of such a great blessing, we find ways to “give back” – precisely by the decisions we make each day to respond generously to those whose needs may be greater than our own.

A word of affirmation is an easy way to do that. It does not cost two cents – but for the recipient it can be solid gold, a life-saver: “*Someone thinks I am worth it!*” A word of affirmation can be the boost needed for the day – or for a lifetime.

This Christmas affirm someone – anyone – a child, a sibling, a friend, a neighbour! Watch how it affects them. You have done something that will have a ripple effect touching many! It is truly a gift that keeps on giving!
