The Dessert Social was the vehicle through which people came together to celebrate the arrival and settling in of our family from the Democratic Republic of Congo. Shinga and Esperance, and their children Yves, Redard, Agape, Uwera and Blaise, were the star attraction.

This event became the impetus for an amazing web of communication, sharing, and connections in the name of fundraising for our family. Members of the four sponsoring churches comprising the Ecumenical Welcoming Partnership – Mt. Zion Lutheran Church, St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church and Church of the Good Shepherd, Swedenborgian – were the centre of the web. We also invited the residents of the two neighbourhoods where the family has lived, Young St. and Roslin St., and Our Lady of Lourdes School community.

Each person then had the opportunity to share mini invitations, posters and email invitations with their family, friends, neighbours and colleagues. The necessity to donate desserts was also imperative for this event to succeed. Musicians donated their time to provide entertainment as well. We enjoyed performances by a student from the Mt. Zion neighbourhood, three musicians from WLU and a professional pianist from our Chinese rental community.

The result was a network that spanned Kitchener and Waterloo. Desserts poured in such that every surface in the Mt. Zion kitchen was covered in containers. Over 200 people attended the event and \$3,626 in donations was raised. A translator helped Shinga and Esperance share their feelings of gratitude and happiness, and thankfulness for God's blessings on their family. They were effusive in thanking the many people who have helped them experience a safe and exciting start in their new home and country.

The most inspiring part of this journey has been the community connections we have experienced. Four churches, two neighbourhoods, one school and two cities' residents have converged in support of one specific cause. Yes, it does *take a village to raise a child*, or in this case, to support a family!
