ECUMENICAL WELCOMING PARTNERSHIP UPDATE: It's been over a year since Shinga, Esperance and their 5 children dropped into our lives and our official responsibilities are completed. The members of the EWP are happy about where the family sits in "Month 13" and beyond. Shinga has found full time employment and Esperance has also started part time work. With the child tax benefit and other incentives the family is financially self-supporting. Young Blaise started kindergarten and Yves started high school and all of the children seem to have settled well in school. They are managing their busy lives in Canada. They say they are relieved of worry here. They don't worry about being hungry, or sick or safe.

It has been a year of joy and challenges with many people of each of our congregations stepping up when needed to help out. The committee is very thankful for the gifts of time, talents and, indeed, money provided by the congregations. We raised around \$40,000 and have spent most of it supporting the family for the first 12 months, as we have struggled to get approval for the child tax benefit. What remains will be given to the family to help pay their travel loan from the Canadian government which started at \$10,000. We are winding up and no longer accepting donations.

The committee is left with warm memories filled with laughter and the friendships created with each other and with this charming family. We hope for the continuation of these personal relationships and also the willingness of our congregations to work together in future ecumenical projects.
