Dear Parishioners:

The Thanksgiving holiday and our Oktoberfest celebrations remind us that we are called to joyfully reflect upon our many blessings that come our way over the course of our lives. But sometimes things come our way that aren't obvious as blessings. But as our psalm proclaims this weekend: "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth".

Many of you have witnessed how emotional I was when the Holy Father mandated me and two other priests of our diocese as Missionaries of Mercy for the Jubilee Year. When in Rome for the commissioning on Ash Wednesday I experienced a profound awareness that this Year of Mercy was going to change my life. Little did I know what it would entail. For the first few months I had the opportunity to carry out that mandate by ministering to others. After my cancer diagnosis in May I have been on the receiving end of that ministry by the compassion, prayer, care and support of others. I could not have asked for more from parishioners, family and friends and the medical professionals who have provided excellent care and direction over the past few months.

The most significant treatment has been the chemotherapy. As many who have been touched by cancer either directly or indirectly are aware, chemotherapy is a balancing act of trying to diminish or eliminate the cancer without having too many side effects on the healthy cells. I was able to complete five cycles of chemo before my body said "Enough!" An assessment of my present situation shows that the cancer in the lungs, lymph nodes and prostate is presently "in hiding", and the spread of the cancer to the bone has remained the same or shows slight improvement. While there continues to be some pain, it is being managed well. Fatigue, both physical and emotional, continue to be present but not as profound as when I was receiving chemo.

You will see me out and about and I will be present in some ministry when I am able. I would ask your continued prayers that I may continue to recognize "the help of the Lord, who made heaven and earth". Thank you again for your faith-filled support and prayers
