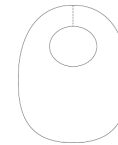

Our white baptismal garment shows that we are a “new creation”, a new member of Christ's Body, the Church. We are looking for someone who could make for us some baptismal bibs which are placed on the child at the time of baptism and then given to the family. The design is simple and only a half dozen or so are needed each month. These bibs are best sewn on a serger.
