

CAMPAIGN COMING THIS WAY Preparations are underway in our parish for the "One Heart, One Soul" Campaign. Across the diocese, early returns are promising! Through mid-May, 14 Pilot Wave parishes have raised a total of more than \$2.5 million, and an additional \$1.6 million have been pledged by other diocesan supporters and organizations. That total is about 12 percent of the campaign's \$35 million goal. The Pilot Wave will run through June, and three larger, additional waves will follow as the campaign gathers steam and continues through early 2021. Our parish is among more than 30 parishes and a number of mission churches taking part in the next wave. Through the summer, preparations will include forming a volunteer team, developing campaign materials and identifying projects. Kickoff Weekend is tentatively set for September. The campaign is aimed at strengthening parishes and several diocesan wide ministries.
