MESSAGE FOR CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK 2022

The theme for this year's Catholic Education Week is "Rebuild, Restore, Renew Together". In the book of Revelation, we hear the voice of God: "See, I am making all things new." (Revelation 21:5) Even after a long and arduous two years, a loving God consoles us with the promise that there are better and brighter days ahead.

The weight of the pandemic has taken a toll. With continued care and protection of one another, the days of "normal" seem to be right around the corner. It is time to focus our attention on the work of restoration, learning how to "be" in a way that is new, building a strong and sturdy foundation for a post-COVID world.
